


# Spring has finally sprung and summer's almost here!!



### **Bubbles**

2 cups Joy dish detergent

6 cups water

3/4 cup white Karo syrup

Combine. Let settle for 4 hours. Store covered in refrigerator

Kool-Aid Play Dough

2 cups water

2 Tbsp. oil

Bring to a boil. Then add:

1 1/2 cups flour

1/2 cup salt

1 Tbsp. alum

2 pkgs unsweetened Kool-Aid

Mix, then knead well. Makes a soft, smooth, good smelling dough. Store in refrigerator.
